




ABOUT OUR SPEAKER

1) What is one College or Chi Alpha experience that prepared you to be a witness in the marketplace?

2) Briefly describe your current job and marketplace experience.

James and Amberlee Rich are Chi Alpha sweethearts who live in Meridian, Idaho. They believe being a missionary is not a career choice but rather a lifestyle. We are active in multiple ministries at our church, we have fire pit s'more sessions in our front yard and invite friends and neighbors over, and we're wanting to build community and fellowship around our everyday lives.

James was a Chi Alpha missionary for two years, marketing director, and now he works with his Chi Alpha roommate in his painting business. He's able to go into people's homes and give paint bids, which has given him opportunities to pray for them. Plus, he is the project manager and is able to witness to the painting crew. And on the side, James helps market Christian-run businesses and non-profits.

Amberlee was a middle school teacher for five years, which gave her the opportunity to pray silently for students while they walked in the halls. She started a before-school prayer group with other Christian teachers. Today, Amberlee is a stay-at-home mom, blogger, and online educator. She's using her giftings to help mom's ditch survival mode and be more intentional with all the resources God gives us like our time, money, and our family. One of the biggest lessons Amberlee has been learning is that mixing your faith into your business is life-giving! You don't have to separate the two!

Scott & Audrey Mendenhall

1) What is one College experience that prepared you to be a witness in the marketplace?

Scott: I was not walking with God during college although I occasionally attended church to keep my parents thinking I was doing okl So my college experiences largely consisted of me being fainly diligent about getting decent grades but partying fainly heavily during my undergraduate career followed by focusing more on studies while attending graduate school, writing my master's thesis, etc. In a weird sort-of-way these experiences help me to understand non-Christian people, the party lifestyle, being promiscuous, and chasing success. I also am quite conscious of the fact that, if it weren't for Jesus' rescuing me and saving me. I'd be divorced, estranged from my children, and probably an alcoholic! This helps me to empathize with people and their struggles and keeps me from having a judgmental attitude towards them. "But for the grace of God, there go II"



Audrey: While attending ultrasound school in Denver, once a week I traveled to the University Hospital in down-town Denver. During some of these commutes, I would pass a group of people picketing an abortion clinic. It would clog traffic and slow my commute, many times causing me to be tardy. I never knew what days they would be there, so I couldn't plan ahead. It infuriated me that these folks interfered with my commute and slowed traffic. I believed that abortion was a personal decision and they didn't have any business being there. A few months into my ultrasound training, I began doing first trimester ultrasounds, some of which were to date the pregnancy for an abortion. Peering in to life in the womb and seeing a heartbeat on babies as small as 3mm, totally changed my view on abortion. From that "Ah Ha" moment. I had a paradigm shift and understood why people would take time and clog traffic in hopes of saving one precious baby. At that time I was not a Christian, my new ideology was based solely on being able to see and listen to a baby's heartbeat on ultrasound. Later, I became a Christ follower and believe God has provided me with a unique privilege to share in life's first moments. My hope is that every pregnant mom, dad and family will be able to celebrate their unborn child.

2) Briefly describe your current job and market place experience.

We own and operate a diagnostic medical ultrasound imaging business with clinics in Helena and Butte. We employ about 10 people and see 20-25 patients each day, the majority of which are for pregnancy ultrasounds. There is a broad cross-section of society that we perform ultrasounds on including single moms, drug users, old, young, kids, etc. We strive to treat each one as "made in the image of Christ."

We believe the First 1,000 days of a child's life (conception until 2 years of age) are critical to their cognitive development. In doing a little extra during each ultrasound exam for each pregnant mom and family, we hope to encourage positive life style choices that will enhance their child's development.

Not all pregnancies have a positive outcome, and our hope is that in these circumstances we will provide compassion and the love of Christ in some very heartbreaking and difficult situations.

As employers for 27+ years we've had several employees from all walks of life. We've had mostly positive experiences but have also had employee's steal, cheat on time-cards, cause lots of drama and upheaval and even bring frivolous lawsuits against us. We've walked with employee's who've been very sick, lost love-ones and who are very lost and searching for significance and meaning.

We also have interactions with referring physicians and their staff, equipment vendors, and a variety of others who provide supplies, services or are involved with various contracts with us. We've had opportunities to treat people well, be fair in contractual negotiations, etc. but also have been tempted to cheat, take advantage of and treat people poorly. Early on in our business we read a book called "Business by the Book" and have attempted to apply Biblical principles even at trying times in all our business dealings.

Finally, like many small businesses, we've had our share of ups and downs, successes, failures, betrayals, pressure and blessings. Along the way, we've also had the privilege of employing some fantastic people, providing life-saving diagnoses to patients, and having the thrill of introducing thousands of parents to their unborn babies! It has been a heavy weight at times knowing that many families rely on us for their monthly income and livelihoods, but we've also enjoyed financial success that has enabled us to provide financial resources to help resource the kingdom and a broad array of ministries over the past 27 years.

Buelah Kondra

1) What is one College or Chi Alpha experience that prepared you to be a witness in the marketplace?

I was an international student at Purdue University when I got plugged into Chi Alpha. 2) Briefly describe your current job and marketplace experience.

products that solve business problems for ebay and my typical day is spent interacting with multiple stakeholders across teams within the company. One main thing that has stuck with me from my Chi Alpha experience is the concept of 'Belong Before Belief'. I consistently try to apply that at work by ensuring that I make real connections with my coworkers before broaching topics of faith. Eventually as people open their lives, it has been easier to pray with them or talk to them about God. It has also been encouraging to see God open the doors for a prayer / fellowship buddy at work and we have been working towards a more structured Bible study. Where God leads, He provides and I am grateful for my current, job because it also provides great flexibility for me to be a volunteer staff with Chi Alpha at the University of Utah, where I have been able to use my extra time to see God do more cool things in students' lives.

<u>Job.</u> Practice stellar work habits and attitudes in your summer job. 32-38 hrs/week, various schedules, \$11-\$12/hr.


